(ALBUQUERQUE, New Mexico) – Winter snowpack, projected spring runoff, potential fire dangers and their effect on statewide recreational opportunities at New Mexico's rivers, lakes and state parks will be the focus of a "Reservoir Levels and Recreational Opportunities" joint news conference to be held in Albuquerque on March 27, 2009.

Interstate Stream Commission Director Estevan López, Deputy Secretary of Tourism Jennifer Hoffman, State Parks Division Director Dave Simon, New Mexico State Forester Arthur "Butch" Blazer, and Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Deputy Secretary Reese Fullerton will all be delivering remarks.

WHEN: Friday, March 27, 2009

WHERE: Tingley Beach
1800 Tingley Drive SW
Albuquerque, New Mexico

LOCATION: Tingley Beach is located on Tingley Drive, south of Central Ave and just east of the Rio Grande in Albuquerque. Exit I-25 at the Martin Luther King Blvd exit and then continue south to Central Ave. Turn right (west) on Central through the downtown area, past 14th Street, past Rio Grande Ave, the Botanic Gardens and Aquarium, etc, then just after New York Ave turn left onto Tingley. The park is on the right. Look for the Tingley train depot/concession and drive past it and the ponds to the second entrance. Turn right once into the entrance. There's a big ball sculpture called Fishglobe where the news conference will be. We'll be on the lawn.
