**(ALBUQUERQUE, New Mexico)** – Winter snowpack, projected spring runoff, potential fire dangers and their effect on statewide recreational opportunities at New Mexico's rivers, lakes and state parks will be the focus of a **"Reservoir Levels and Recreational Opportunities"** joint news conference to be held in Albuquerque on **Monday, March 29, 2010**.

State Engineer John D'Antonio, Energy Minerals & Natural Resources Department Secretary Jon Goldstein, and New Mexico Tourism Department Advertising, Marketing and Promotions Manager Richard Eeds will all be delivering remarks.

**WHERE:** Tingley Beach

**LOCATION:** Tingley Beach is located on Tingley Drive, south of Central Ave and just east of the Rio Grande in Albuquerque. Exit I-25 at the Martin Luther King Blvd exit and then continue south to Central Ave. Turn right (west) on Central through the downtown area, past 14th Street, past Rio Grande Ave, the Botanic Gardens and Aquarium, etc, then just after New York Ave turn left onto Tingley Drive. The park is on the right. Look for the Tingley train depot/concession and drive past it and the ponds to the second entrance. Turn right once into the entrance. There's a large ball sculpture called Fishglobe where the news conference will be. We'll be on the lawn.
