



NECESSARY LEGAL DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR: *INDIVIDUAL*

New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission Lower Rio Grande 2022-2023 Groundwater Conservation Pilot Program

If you are an individual applying for acceptance into the New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission Lower Rio Grande Groundwater Conservation Pilot Program (the Program) and are also the property owner of the proposed enrollment acreage to be dedicated to the Program, you must provide the following documentation:

- A validly executed and recorded deed in your name. If you own the property under a real estate contract or installment sale contract, you must provide an executed and recorded copy of the appropriate real estate document that represents your ownership in the proposed enrollment acreage.
- If there is more than one property owner (co-tenants), you must provide validly executed and recorded deeds that account for all present ownership interests in the proposed acreage. Each co-tenant must consent to the dedication of the proposed acreage to the Program and must also thereby execute the Lower Rio Grande Water Conservation Pilot Program Grant Agreement (Grant Agreement) and Memorandum of Agreement (Negative Easement) in order to be accepted into the Program.

If you are an individual applying for acceptance into the Program and are **not** the property owner of the proposed enrollment acreage to be dedicated to the Program, you must provide the following documentation:

- A validly executed and recorded deed in the name of the property owner(s).
- A validly executed written lease between you and the property owner(s).
- If you do not have a validly executed lease, you must provide other evidence of your right to dedicate the proposed enrollment acreage to the Program.
