AFFIDAVIT OF JUANITA ORTIZ

I, Juanita Ortiz, being duly sworn, depose and say as follows:

1. In 1941 I married Jose Hilario Ortiz.
2. In that year we moved into a little house located behind the house occupied, and later inherited, by Elena Ortiz, now deceased. The two houses are located in the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 12, Township 19 North, Range 8 East, and near Tract 16, Map Sheet 19, as represented on the Upper Rio Grande Hydrographic Survey (Nambe-Pojoaque-Tesuque).
3. At that time (1941) the domestic needs of both houses were served by an open pit well.

4. I am informed and therefore believe and allege that this open well was replaced by a professionally drilled well in 1956. This 1956 well was adjudicated together with subfile 19.16 by Judge Payne's Court Order of March 14, 1969 with apparent disregard of the fact that the well was a replacement for an older well.

5. While my direct recollection of the original well only goes back to 1941, this old family well undoubtedly dates back considerably further, possibly centuries.

6. The old well was used continuously for domestic purposes at least from the time of my own recollection of it in 1941 until it was replaced.
