NOTICE is hereby given that on May 9, 2019, Roland Kent Sanchez and Elia F. Sanchez, c/o Tim Ott, 703 South Christopher Rd, Belen, NM 87002, filed Application No. SD-04257-A into RG-193 POD2 with the **STATE ENGINEER** for Permit to Change Point of Diversion and Change Place of Use from Surface Water to Groundwater within the Rio Grande Basin in the State of New Mexico.

The applicant proposes to permanently discontinue the diversion and use of a farm delivery requirement (FDR) of 9.111 acre-feet per annum of surface water, inclusive of a consumptive irrigation requirement (CIR) of 6.377 acre-feet per annum, from the Lower Arroyos Ditch, with a point of diversion on the Rio Grande at the Isleta Diversion Dam (SP-1690-3) on land owned by the Pueblo of Isleta, at a point where X = 369,686 feet and Y = 1,421,189 feet intersect, NM State Plane, NAD 27, for the irrigation of 3.037 acres of land owned by Dexter Griego. The subject water rights appurtenant to the 3.037 acres of move-from land were sold to Roland Kent Sanchez and Elia F. Sanchez. The move-from land is described as Tract C2B2 on MRGCD Map 112, within Section 13, Township 4 North, Range 1 East, NMPM. This move-from land is generally located 1.3 miles southeast of the intersection of NM-116 and Estevan Lopez, Belen, Valencia County, New Mexico.

The applicants further propose to transfer the above described CIR water right and commence the drought relief irrigation of 169.43 acres of land owned by Roland Kent Sanchez and Elia F. Sanchez, described as Tracts A-1, A-2, A-3, A-4, A-5, B, C-1, C-2, C-3, & C-4 Land of Schwartzman Farms West, on MRGCD Map 117, within Section 25, Township 4 North, Range 1 East, NMPM from existing well RG-193 POD2 located at Latitude 34°32'49"North and Longitude 106°47'02"West (WGS84). This move-to land and well are generally located 1.2 miles southeast of the intersection of NM-116 and NM-346, Bosque, Valencia County, New Mexico.

Any person, firm or corporation or other entity having standing to file objections or protests shall do so in writing (objection must be legible, signed, and include the writer's complete name, phone number, email address, and mailing address). The objection to the approval of the application must be based on: (1) Impairment; if impairment, you must specifically identify your water rights*; and/or (2) Public Welfare/Conservation of Water; if public welfare or conservation of water within the state of New Mexico, you must show how you will be substantially and specifically affected. The written protest must be filed, in triplicate, with the State Engineer, 5550 San Antonio Drive NE, Albuquerque, NM 87109, within ten (10) days after the date of the last publication of this Notice. Facsimiles (faxes) will be accepted as a valid protest as long as the hard copy is hand-delivered or mailed and postmarked within 24-hours of the facsimile. Mailing postmark will be used to validate the 24-hour period. Protests can be faxed to the Office of the State Engineer, (505) 383-4030. If no valid protest or objection is filed, the State Engineer will evaluate the application in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 72 NMSA 1978.
