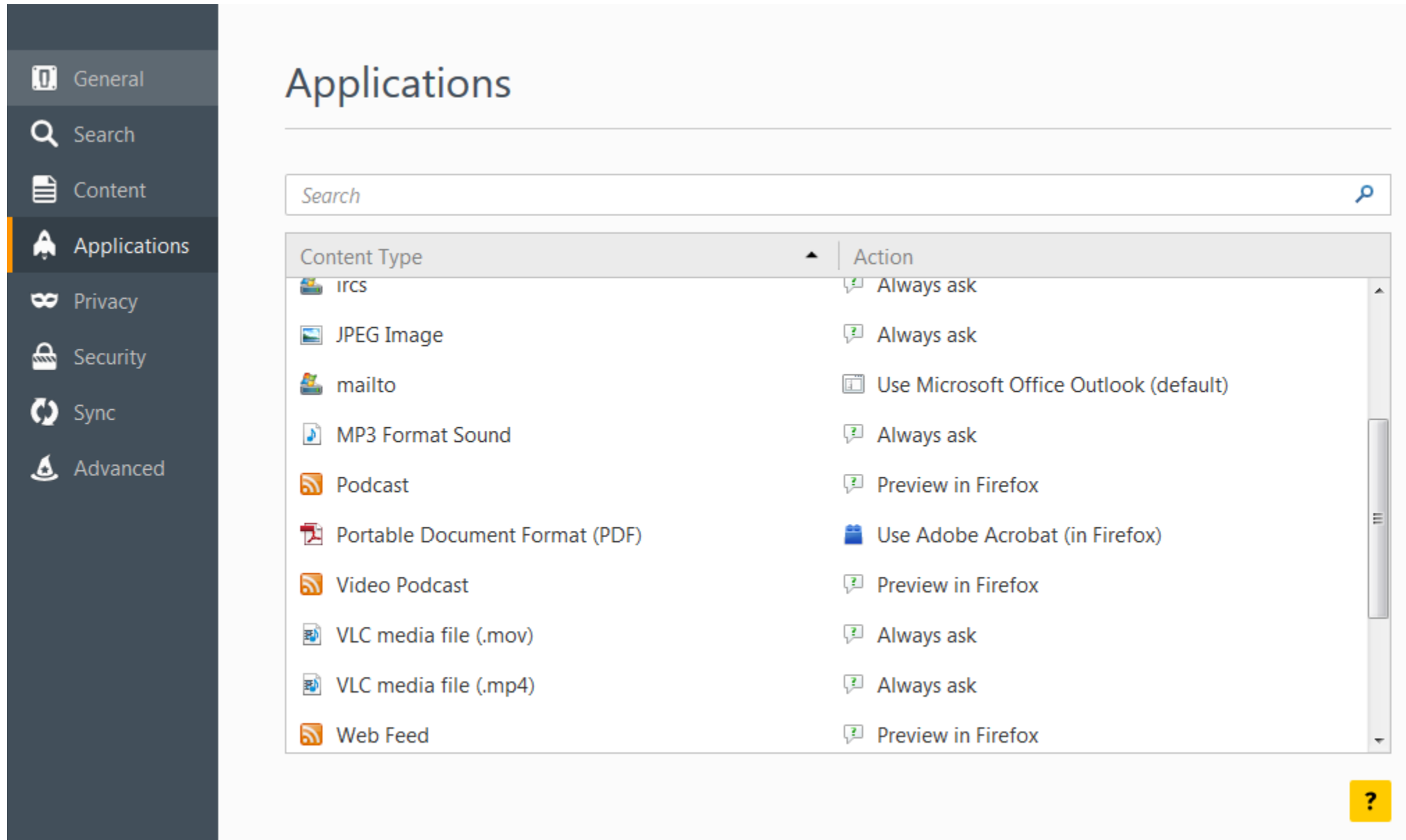


For links in PDF's to work in newer releases of Firefox you just need to do a couple things, first in the Firefox Options, under Applications, for Portable Document Format (PDF), select Use Adobe Acrobat (in Firefox).

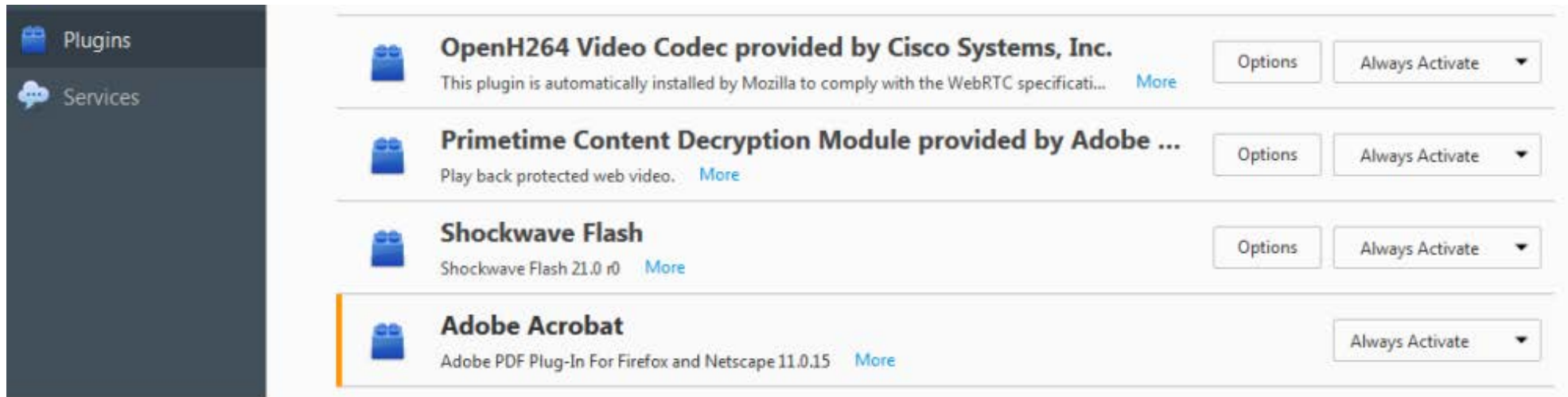
